**ORDER OF SUSPENSION OF
TRADING**

It appears to the Securities and Exchange Commission that the public interest and the protection of investors require a suspension in the trading of the securities of Electric Car Company, Inc. (“Electric Car” or the “Company”) (CIK # 0001391117), a Delaware corporation, because of questions regarding the accuracy and adequacy of information about the Company and its securities in the marketplace, the Company’s operating status, if any, and unusual and unexplained trading activity affecting the market for its securities, including: (a) that the Company has not filed any reports with the Commission since 2011 or otherwise released any information about its operations; (b) the Company’s telephone number listed on its profile page on OTC markets belongs to a different company; (c) despite the absence of any publicly available news from the Company since 2011, Electric Car’s share price and trading volume have greatly increased since January 2021; and (d) the increased share price and trading volume coincided with social media posts from late January onward that appear to be attempting to influence the market for the stock.

The Company's common stock is quoted and traded on OTC Link, whose parent company is OTC Markets Group Inc., under the ticker symbol ELCR. As of April 5, 2021, the Company's common stock had six market makers and was eligible for the "piggyback" exception of Exchange Act Rule 15c2-11(f)(3).

The Commission is of the opinion that the public interest and the protection of investors require a suspension of trading in the securities of the above-listed Company.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, pursuant to Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, that trading in the securities of the above-listed Company is suspended for the period from 9:30 a.m. EDT on April 19, 2021, through 11:59 p.m. EDT on April 30, 2021.
