

Wayne Landsman is the KPMG Professor of Accounting at the Kenan-Flagler Business School, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is also the Associate Dean of the School's Ph.D. Programs, and he served as accounting chairman from 1991-1998. Professor Landsman graduated Magna cum Laude in economics from Princeton University, AB, 1978, and earned his MBA (1980), MS in statistics (1983) and Ph.D. in business (1984) from Stanford University. He has published over sixty articles in leading scholarly and professional journals on topics dealing with the role of accounting information in capital price formation. Topics of research include pensions, employee stock options, asset securitization, and fair value accounting. Professor Landsman was president of the Financial Accounting and Reporting Section of the American Accounting Association and served on the Financial Accounting Standards Advisory Council, which advises the Financial Accounting Standards Board, from 1998-2001.
