COMMISSION RELEASES UPDATED LISTING OF ANTICIPATED MAJOR REGULATORY ACTIVITIES

Because the Commission must respond to developments in the capital markets, changes in economic conditions, new Congressional priorities and similar circumstances not easily predictable, no such listing can be definitive. Accordingly, while the Commission believes that the information contained in the release will be of use to interested persons, those affected by Commission action should not rely solely upon this document. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELFASES

THE CAPITOL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY
