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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

### U.S. SECURITIES AND

### EXCHANGE COMMISSION INFORMATION

The Commission announced the issuance of a release amending Regulation S-X to delete the requirement for disclosure of replacement cost information once the disclosure requirements of Statement of Financial Accounting Standards No. 33, "Financial Reporting and Changing Prices," are fully effective (fiscal years ending after December 25, 1980). In the interim period, the Commission will not require disclosure of replacement cost information by registrants who voluntarily present current cost information in their annual reports. (Rel. 33-6139)

#### ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO RULE 17a-19 AND FORM X-17A-19

The Commission has announced the adoption of amendments to Rule 17a-19 and Form X-17A-19 that (1) rescind the requirement that self-regulatory organizations give telegraphic notice of the changes in membership status of any member for which it is the designated examining authority; (2) rescind the requirement that a copy of Form X-17A-19 be filed at the regional office of the Commission for which the member has its principal place of business; (3) revise the description of Form S-17A-19 at 17 CFR 249.635 to conform to a previous amendment to Rule 17a-19; and (4) revise Form X-17A-19 to incorporate certain minor changes. #### PROPOSAL OF AMENDMENTS TO RULES 17a-19 AND 17a-5(b)

The Commission has proposed amendments to Rule 17a-19 which would eliminate the exemption from filing Form X-17A-19 if previous notice has been filed. The Commission has also proposed amendments to Rule 17a-5(b) to extend the filing requirements of that rule to registered national securities associations and their members. 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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

### SIPC APPOINTED IN THE LIQUIDATION OF HAMILTON/COOKE & CO. OF FLORIDA INC.

The Atlanta Regional Office and the Miami Branch Office announced that on October 4 U.S. District Court Judge William M. Hoeverler entered an order appointing the Securities Investor Protection Corporation for the purpose of liquidating

Hamilton/Cooke & Co. of Florida Inc., a securities broker-dealer located in Miami, Florida. Based upon this order, which provided for the removal of the liquidation proceeding to the Bankruptcy Court, and without any hearing or determination on the merits, and without prejudice, the Commission withdrew its application for injunctive relief against Hamilton/Cooke. (SEC v. Hamilton/Cooke & Co. of Florida, Inc., S.D. Fla., Civil Action No. 79-4446-CIV-WMH). (LR-8901)

#### COMPLAINT NAMES WYOMING COAL CORPORATION AND JACK C. BRADLEY, JR.

The Denver Regional Office announced on October 15 the filing of a civil complaint in the U.S. District Court of Wyoming against Wyoming Coal Corporation and Jack C. Bradley, Jr. seeking to enjoin them from violating the bookkeeping and periodic reporting requirements of the Exchange Act of 1934. The complaint alleges, among other things, that since on or about December 1, 1977 Wyoming Coal, aided and abetted by Bradley, failed to make and keep books, records and accounts of Wyoming Coal which accurately and fairly reflected the transactions and dispositions of assets of Wyoming Coal. The complaint further alleges that Wyoming Coal, aided and abetted by Bradley, failed to file required annual, quarterly and current reports with the Commission as required by Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and rules promulgated thereunder.

On the same date the Honorable Clarence A. Brimmer, Judge of the U.S. District Court for the District of Wyoming, entered a judgment permanently enjoining the defendants pursuant to the consent of said defendants in which they neither admitted nor denied the allegations of the complaint. The Judgment also required the defendants to file their delinquent reports within three months of the date of the Final Judgment, to make a report to stockholders of Wyoming Coal and to convene a stockholders meeting within 60 days of the filing of the required reports and to make current and maintain adequate books and records of all transactions of Wyoming Coal. 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## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

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#### RICHARD S. BERRY SENTENCED

The Denver Regional Office announced that on September 17 the Honorable Valdemar A. Cordova, U.S. District Judge for the District of Arizona at Phoenix, sentenced Richard S. Berry, an attorney, to three years imprisonment upon Berry's conviction of one count of conspiracy to obstruct an investigation, commit perjury and suborn perjury before the Commission and falsely testify in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Texas. (U.S. v. Richard S. Berry, U.S.D.C., Dist. of Ariz., CR-79-038 PHX). (LR-8903)
