DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO THE DIRECTOR OF  
THE DIVISION OF MARKET REGULATION

### U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The Commission announced an amendment to its rules which delegates to the Director of the Division of Market Regulation the authority to publish notice of and to approve plans for allocating regulatory responsibilities filed by self-regulatory organizations pursuant to Rule 17d-2 and amendments thereto. The amendment is effective upon publication in the Federal Register.

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ORDER OF PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION ENTERED  
AGAINST JAMES R. CRAWFORD, OTHERS

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on October 5 Judge Nicholas J. Walinski entered an order of preliminary injunction against James R. Crawford (Crawford), J.R. Crawford Consulting and Financial Planning, Inc. (Crawford Consulting), Cyclemetric Investment Monitor, Inc. (Cyclemetric), Shadow Valley Financial Corporation (Shadow Valley), and Dennis A. Krause (Krause), all of Toledo, Ohio. The Commission alleged in its complaint among other things, that the defendants violated certain registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the sale of unregistered interests in various limited partnerships and interests in pooled fund accounts in options and commodities. The complaint also alleged, among other things, that they failed to make proper disclosures and keep adequate books and records.

On July 19, Judge Walinski entered an order appointing a receiver for all the property and assets of Crawford Consulting, Cyclemetric and Shadow Valley. On October 17, the duties of the receiver were temporarily suspended until a determination as to the source of his future fees could be had. A hearing on this issue is set for January 18, 1980. During this period, Cyclemetric can resume its business provided it can not solicit new business and Crawford has no access to client funds. However, clients of Cyclemetric must first be given the opportunity to decide if they want to continue their investment advisory arrangements with Cyclemetric. Cyclemetric would then be allowed to bill clients for services done during this period. Fees collected during this period will be subject to the order freezing Cyclemetric's assets. (SEC v. James R. WALTER WENCKE PERMANENTLY ENJOINED IN  
BOOKKEEPERS CASE: DISGORGEMENT ORDERED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that District Judge Leland Nielsen, San Diego, issued a final judgment of permanent injunction against Walter Wencke on November 19 in SEC v. Bookkeepers, Ltd., et al. Wencke was enjoined from violating the antifraud and registration provisions of the securities laws. Wencke was also ordered to disgorge property obtained as a result of the acts alleged in the complaint. The judgment arose out of a Commission action filed in March 1978 alleging a fraudulent scheme to deprive the public shareholders of Bookkeepers, Ltd., an Ontario, California corporation, of their stock in the company through a series of reverse stock splits. The complaint also charged that the securities of Bookkeepers were not registered with the Commission as required by the Securities Exchange Act. Judgment against Wencke was issued following the entry of his default. Wencke was convicted last year on several counts of mail fraud and making false statements to the Commission and was sentenced to a jail term. He failed to appear to commence

serving his sentence and remains a fugitive. The case is pending against the remaining defendants, Bookkeepers, Ltd., and Joseph Margala and Jerry Whitley, its president and vice president, respectively. (SEC v. Bookkeepers, Ltd., et al., S.D. CA CV-79-1715-N). (LR-8937)

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 26 to request a hearing on a proposal by General Public Utilities Corporation (GPU) and its subsidiaries to allocate consolidated Federal income tax liability by a method other than specified by Rule 45(b)(6). (Rel. 35-21323 - Nov. 30)

A notice has also been issued giving interested persons until December 26 to request a hearing on a proposal by GPU to make cash capital contributions from time to time through December 31, 1980 to two of its public utility subsidiaries, Jersey Central Power & Light Company and Metropolitan Edison Company. The capital contributions will aggregate a maximum of \$50 million, with a maximum to either subsidiary of \$30 million. (Rel. 35-21322 - Nov. 30)

### SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 26 to request a hearing on a proposal by Southwestern Electric Power Company, subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to issue and sell up to \$60 million principal amount of its first mortgage bonds at competitive bidding. The proceeds of the sale will be used to repay short-term debt which was incurred to finance the company's construction program. (Rel. 35-21324 - Nov. 30)

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## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

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### CSE AND NASD FILE AMENDMENTS TO PLAN FOR ALLOCATING REGULATORY RESPONSIBILITIES

The Cincinnati Stock Exchange, Inc., and the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc., have filed an amendment to their plan for allocating regulatory responsibilities under Rule 17d-2. The proposed amendment would provide for review of customer complaints and advertising of members subject to the plan and for resolution of disputes between the parties to the plan. Interested persons are invited to submit comments (6 copies) to the Secretary of the Commission, 500 N. Capitol St., Washington, D.C. 20549. Comments should refer to File No. 4-273 and should be submitted within 30 days of publication in the Federal Register. (Rel. 34-16389)

### NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board has filed proposed rule changes (SR-MSRB-79-12) which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) to amend MSRB rules A-14 and A-15 to provide that annual fees to the MSRB are due on a fiscal year rather than a calendar year basis. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of December 10. (Rel. 34-16393)
